The Beach to Bay Relay Marathon is a 26.2 mile course sanctioned by the Corpus Christi Roadrunners. It has been deemed the United States' most premier relay running marathon, since there is not another one of its size and magnitude.

Participants have the option of joining a team of six runners (4.4 miles each), two runners (13.1 miles each), or can run the race solo (26.2 miles).

This year the starting line will be moved back to its original location: Padre Balli Park and will conclude at Water's Edge Park.
